

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

Min.01/11/2024- Preliminary

The meeting was called to order and opened with a word of prayer by the Municipal Social Safeguards Officer at 10:15 AM. He welcomed all participants and appreciated them for attending the public participation forum.

Min.02/11/2024- Review of the First 5 Years Strategic Plan and Handing Over of Completed Projects

The Municipal Manager thanked the community for their continued support. He informed participants that the Municipal Board, in collaboration with the Municipality leadership, is reviewing the first strategic plan to assess achievements, challenges, and gaps in preparation for the next phase.

a. Handing Over of Completed Projects:

- All completed projects under the Urban Development Grant (UDG) Phase I were officially handed over to the relevant departments. Community members were advised on how to apply or be allocated modern market stalls, kiosks, and public toilets.

Min.03/11/2024- Local Economy Promotion

Participants were briefed on strategies to promote the local economy:

- Construction and operationalization of strategic markets and stalls.
- Provision of affordable and accessible capital to vendors and traders.
- Support for locals to undertake business management training.
- Adoption of trade-facilitative regulations.
- Establishment of modern abattoirs.
- Upgrading roads to all-weather standards to improve access and stimulate economic activities.
- Promotion of multimodal transport (vehicular, pedestrian, and bicycle lanes).
- Provision of boda-boda sheds at strategic locations.
- Encouragement of public-private partnerships and joint ventures in housing and infrastructure.
- Promotion of affordable building technologies.
- Enforcement against illegal land subdivisions.
- Upgrading and constructing health facilities to reduce access distances.
- Provision of specialized facilities targeting vulnerable groups.
- Expansion of water supply through household reticulation and borehole drilling.

- Provision of adequate educational facilities and encouragement of private investment in education.
- Public awareness campaigns on safe waste disposal and reuse.
- Licensing and regulation of small-scale private waste collectors

Min.04/11/2024- Community Feedback on Completed Projects

Participants expressed appreciation for completed projects and raised the following issues and suggestions:

1. Limited access to piped water.
2. High cost of licenses and permits.
3. Request for support by the County Government to traders and boda boda groups to access loans, as many do not qualify for bank/SACCO financing.
4. High cost of certified potato seeds.
5. Long queues at the NCPB Jua Kali seed issuance point due to it being the only center.
6. Request to allocate idle public land for communal farming.
7. Proposal to involve the public in bursary issuance processes to identify deserving cases.
8. Call to increase bursary allocations due to rising school fees

Min.05/11/2024- Any Other Business (A.O.B)

The Municipal Social Safeguard Officer addressed the issue of Gender-Based Violence (GBV) and outlined the following ongoing interventions:

1. **Public Participation:**
 - Communities are actively engaged in discussions and decisions regarding GBV prevention and response.
2. **Sensitization Campaigns:**
 - Educational outreach to men and women on GBV impacts and preventive strategies.
3. **Partnerships:**
 - Collaboration with organizations like CREAW to train staff and community champions on GBV response and case handling.
4. **Addressing Root Causes:**
 - Programs such as sports initiatives for men, women, and youth to challenge social norms that perpetuate GBV and promote community resilience.

5. Focus on Prevention:

- Strengthening referral systems and action plans to safeguard vulnerable groups from GBV, HIV/AIDS, and teenage pregnancies.




