Summary of Discussion:

- 1. Meeting Commencement: The meeting commenced at the scheduled time followed by welcoming all attendees and expressing gratitude for their participation in discussing crucial municipal policies aimed at enhancing community welfare.
- 2. Review and Discussion of Municipal Service Charter: The Head of Municipal Services presented the draft Municipal Service Charter outlining the objectives, standards, and commitments of the municipality towards delivering efficient and equitable services to residents. The charter was open for discussion, and attendees provided valuable feedback regarding the clarity of service descriptions, processed timelines, and mechanisms for addressing service complaints and grievances.
- 3. Gender Mainstreaming Framework: The Gender Mainstreaming Framework was introduced as part of the municipality's commitment to promoting gender equality and women's empowerment. Attendees emphasized the need to embed gender considerations across all municipal programs and initiatives, ensuring equitable access to services and opportunities for all residents. Strategies were discussed to mainstream gender perspectives in policy development, budgeting, and service delivery processes. - 4. Presentation and Feedback on Risk Management Policy Fra Lework: The Risk Management Officer delivered a presentation on the proposed Risk Management Policy Framework aimed at identifying, assessing, and mitigating risks associated with municipal operations and service delivery. Attendees engaged in a constructive discussion, highlighting the importance of proactive risk identification, stakeholder involvement, and contingency planning. Suggestions were made to strengthen the framework's resilience against potential threats and uncertainties.
- 5. Deliberation on Public Participation Framework Policy: The Public Participation Coordinator introduced the draft Public Participation Framework Policy: emphasizing the municipality's commitment to fostering inclusive and transparent decision-making processes. Community representatives provided input on strategies to endice public engagement, including the utilization of digital platforms, community outreach programs, and feedback mechanisms. There was consensus on the need to ensure diverse representation and accessibility in participatory initiatives.

Any Other Business:

- Ward Administrator acknowledged the contributions of all participants and encouraged ongoing collaboration in shaping municipal policies that reflect community needs and aspirations.
- It was agreed to circulate the revised versions of the discussed policies for further review and input from stakeholders before finalization.

Summary of Discussion:

• The meeting commenced with an overview of the current status of the municipal budge allocation for the 2019/2020 Financial Year (FY). It was highlighted that the municipal vote was lacking in the county budget for this FY.

- However, efforts are underway to address this issue, with a draft vote for the municipality currently being prepared for consideration in the supplementary budget for the 2019/2020 FY.
- Discussions ensued regarding staffing issues within the municipality. It was noted that engagements are in progress to identify officers for secondment to the municipality to bolster its operational capacity.
- A list of 34 officers has been forwarded for consideration in this regard,
- An update was provided regarding the involvement of the County Project Coordination Team (CPCT) from the Department of Lands, Physical Planning, and Url Development in collaborating with municipal managers. Currently, they are actively engaged in various projects and initiatives within the municipality.
- Participants emphasized the importance of gender mainstreaming in murgipal governance and project implementation. It was agreed upon that gender perspectives should be integrated into all aspects of municipal planning, budgeting, and decision-making processes to ensure inclusivity and equity.
- Additionally, the need to ensure that Gender Responsive Budgeting (GRB) principles are incorporated into the municipal budgeting process was highlighted. This includes 'allocating resources in municipality.

Next Steps:

- The municipality will continue to work closely with county authorities to ensure the inclusion of the municipal vote in the supplementary budget for the 2019/2020 FY.
- Efforts will be intensified to address staffing needs by identifying suitable officers for secondment to the municipality.
- Ongoing collaboration between the County Project Coordination Team and municipal managers will be maintained to facilitate the effective implementation of projects and initiatives.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 2:00pm with a word of prayer.

Summary of Discussion:

- Residents expressed support for the proposed projects, recognizing their importance in enhancing the quality of life in the community.
- Concerns were raised regarding the effectiveness of the drainage system, particularly during heavy rainfall, and suggestions were made for better planning and maintenance.
- The need for street lights around key areas such as JM Hospital, Rurii Stage, and various junctions was emphasized to improve safety and visibility, especially during the night.
- Residents welcomed the initiative to distribute water from existing boreholes, highlighting the significance of access to clean and reliable water sources.
- Improvements to roads, including Ndurua Road, Gachengo Road By-pass, and Carbro from Kahuruko to Peace Church Ha Chief, were seen as vital for enhancing transportation and connectivity within the ward.
- Garbage collection services were discussed, with residents urging for regular and efficient waste management to maintain cleanliness and hygiene in the community.
- The development of a bus park was viewed positively as it would provide a centralized location for transportation services, benefiting both residents and commuters passing through the area.

Next Steps:

- The municipality will consider the feedback provided and work towards incorparating suggestions into the planning and execution of the projects.
- Further consultations may be organized to address specific concerns and gather additional input: from the community.
- Regular updates will be shared with residents to keep them informed about the progress of the development initiatives.
